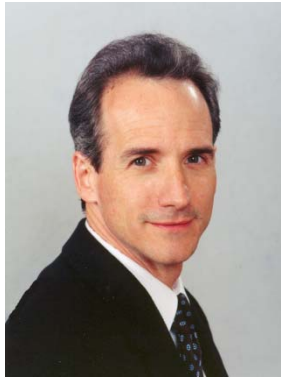


Evidenced Based Treatment of Venous Leg Ulcerations: Modern Compression Therapy

Dr. Serena is the Founder and Medical Director of the Penn North Centers for Advanced Wound Care™. He has published more than 75 papers and given over 175 presentations throughout the world. In 2003, he was elected to the board of directors of The Wound Healing Society and now serves as chairman of the industrial relations committee. He authored four of the Societies national guidelines for chronic wounds. In 2008 he was elected to the board of directors of the American College of Hyperbaric Medicine.

To date, Penn North™, under his direction, operates more than 20 wound care centers across the United States. He is the chief operating officer of the Oxygen-8™ hyperbaric medicine centers, with clinics from New York City to the west coast. Dr. Serena has been the lead or Principal investigator in over 40 clinical trials. Dr. Serena is the Health Volunteers Overseas program director for Phnom Penh, Cambodia.
